There is intended flexibility in much of your individual course scheduling from semester to semester. This is a *department-suggested* course plan to assist you and reflects pre-requisites for major courses. You will need to adapt each semester based on course availability, course performance, and other related scheduled changes. **Note: COMM 460** can only be taken the Spring semester of your planned senior year. **Always work closely with your academic adviser when creating or adjusting your schedule or plan.**

Remember:

LU requires 120 total earned credits to graduate. You should average 30 credits/year, 15 credits/semester.

*Students with 45 or fewer earned credits **MUST** meet with their adviser to receive a registration PIN number.*

Pursuing a minor helps to guide selecting Open Elective credits, which may range from 27+ credits total.

Students propose internships to the department and your application must be accepted before you're enrolled.
