- **SLIB 691**: Professional Portfolio (1) is offered each fall, spring, and summer.

- SPRING '26** **SLIB 680:** Research Methodology for School Librarians (3) - *Meets five Saturdays*
- SUMMER '26** **Elective Options: SLIB 595; SLIB 685; SLIB 695 (3)** - *For Track 1 ONLY*
- FALL '26** **SLIB 689\***: Supervised Experience in School Libraries (5) - *For Track 2 ONLY*

\* Prior to completion of SLIB 689, you are required to attend at least one full day of a VAASL fall conference or an approved national school library conference.

## TRACK 2 - INITIAL LICENSURE

- In place of an elective, you must complete three 1-credit courses (SLIB 571, 572, 573) that will be scheduled throughout your program in consultation with your program advisor.
